This is a report of the regular meeting of the Rossville Town Council on Tuesday, August 13, 2019 at 6:30 p.m.

On call of the roll: David Severt, Jack Fingerle, and Bill Croto.

Also present were Travis Harris, Chad Colby, Robert Shaffer, Dennis Wagoner, and Clinton and Nicole Mackey.

Dennis Wagoner, representing Angel Hill Golf Course, appeared before the Council seeking a summer sprinkling credit be applied to the business as a majority of their water usage is does not enter wastewater lines due to the nature of the business. After considerable discussion, Bill Croto made a motion to allow a special exception for Angel Hill Golf Course to receive the summer sprinkling credit for three (3) months during the summer, seconded by Jack Fingerle, and passed by Council. The current ordinance will need to be modified.

Clinton and Nicole Mackey, current owners of the Gingerbread Shop, appeared before the Council to discuss the future of the building. They were advised by Council a structural engineer and demolition contractor had been contacted regarding the stability and partial demolition of the building for safety purposes. They stated their vision for the building is no longer an option due to the deterioration of the west half of the building. Council advised the owners the front of the building needs to be addressed for safety.

Chad Colby informed the Council the fencing at the park tower and pump house will be finished shortly. Shawn Morris has begun his water schooling. The issue of take home vehicles was discussed. Jack Fingerle made a motion to update the personnel policy to include and allow the town marshal, deputy marshal, superintendent, and assistant superintendent take home vehicles effective January 1, 2020, seconded by Bill Croto, and passed by Council.

Silverthorn Farms has agreed to a two year contract to accept compost from the Town. The hook lift container would be \$40.00 per load and VacAll at \$20.00 per load. Bill Croto made to motion to approve loads retroactive to January 1, 2019 for \$40.00 per hook life container and \$20.00 per VacAll load and agree to a two(2) contract, seconded by Jack Fingerle, and passed by Council.

The Friendly Gas Station is hoping to get the alley marked for traffic before the Summer's End Festival.

There was discussion of having a meeting with Rossville Area Youth Soccer, Rossville School Corporation, and Rossville Baseball to discuss their future needs for the Rossville Town Park.

Voucher Register was approved and signed.

There being no further business to come before the Council, the meeting was adjourned to Tuesday, September 10, 2019 at the Rossville Town Hall at 6:30 p.m.
