

May 12, 2020

This is a report of the regular called meeting of the Rossville Town Council on Tuesday, May 12, 2020 at 6:30 p.m. at the Rossville Town Hall.

On call of the roll: David Severt, Jack Fingerle, and William Croto.

A letter from Janie Adams requesting an adjustment due to an excessive water leak caused by a toilet was reviewed by Council. After review and discussion, Jack Fingerle made a motion to reduce the wastewater by \$173.55 as a one-time only occurrence due to a leak, seconded by Bill Croto, and passed by Council.

Grass mowing issues were discussed and addressed.

Chad Colby gave an update on the Waterworks Master Plan. The handheld reader has failed and will need to be replaced. Options are being explored. He is hoping to get mulch down at the park the first part of June.

There was discussion of adding Keith Woollen back to the roster of part time laborers. Bill Croto made a motion to reinstate Keith Woollen as a part time laborer, seconded by Jack Fingerle, and passed by Council.

There was discussion of the old shelter house. Chad Colby stated that it has almost reached the point of needing to be renovated or torn down and something put up as a replacement. A decision was tabled.

Community Crossings funding for the next round is still up in the air as to whether there will be funding available.

There was continued discussion of the drainage issue on N. Otten Rd. Council instructed Chad Colby to locate surveyor stakes at the front of the properties before options are considered.

Ordinance 2020-03 was approved at the April 14, 2020 teleconference meeting call. It has now officially been signed by all Council members. The next step is to proceed with transferring the title.

There was discussion of who should be responsible for mowing the Township property at the park. At the current time the Town is using Town funds to pay for the mowing of the Township property. A Township Advisory member stated it would be considered a liability to the Township if they mowed it; however, it would be no different than the Township being responsible for mowing cemeteries in Ross Township.

Chad Colby was asked to perform an inspection of park equipment for worn bolts, clamps, etc.

Approval was given to the Sheet Metal Workers International Association for their donation drive "Dollars Against Diabetes" at the intersection of St. Rd. 26 and 39 on Saturday, June 20th.

Pat McIlrath informed Council the trash and recycle contract will be ending on December 31, 2020 and that we needed to begin the process of advertising for a new contract.

Voucher Register was approved and signed.

There being no further business to come before the Council, the meeting was adjourned to Tuesday, June 9, 2020 at 6:30 p.m. at the Rossville Town Hall.
